



Existing Worker Traineeships

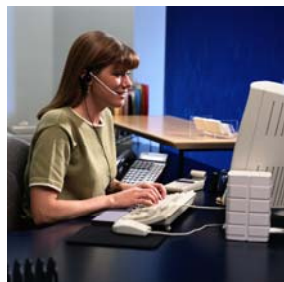
Perfect for employees performing an Information Technology role

Who is eligible?

Any employee who has been employed for 3 months full-time or 12 months part-time and who is currently working in an Information Technology role. Any employee who does not already hold a qualification of Certificate III level or above.

How is the training delivered?

The training is delivered online and in the workplace. Face-to-face workshops are available if required. Workplace training and assessment is conducted by qualified staff.



What are the benefits to employers?

Existing Worker Trainees are exempt from paying the TAFE fee. Employers benefit by having a skilled and qualified workforce. For further information on eligibility and incentives, contact your Australian Apprentice Centre.

What does a trainee need to do?

The first step is to undertake a skills audit with a qualified assessor. This process will identify the required workplace competencies and identify any skills gaps. The trainee's current skills and competencies will also be recognised during this process.

An individual training plan will then be developed for the trainee.

On successful completion of the program, the trainee will receive a nationally recognised qualification from TAFENSW, and a certificate of proficiency.
